

Museum Trip Information

Admission fee: \$2.00 per student; 2 adults per class will be admitted free. Additional adults will be charged the group admission rate of \$3.00. We accept cash, VISA or Master Card. Checks made payable to: College Park Aviation Museum.

Time and Hours: Tours are typically 1 1/2 to 2 hours. Our museum is open 10 am to 5 pm seven days a week. Educational tours must be scheduled in advance by calling 301-864-6029.

Chaperones: Chaperones play an important role at the College Park Aviation Museum. They must provide assistance throughout the tour and model appropriate behavior to the students.

Eating Facilities: The museum has no indoor eating space. However, during pleasant weather outdoor eating areas overlooking the airport are available. You are welcome to bring lunches and eat outside.

Museum Shop: The College Park Aviation's Prop Shop offers a selection of books, toys, gifts and souvenirs for all ages. A large part of the inventory of items is priced under \$2, so that families and young visitors can take home reminders of their visit.

Changes in Transportation - an Interactive Field Trip

Experience the adventures of flying with Wilbur Wright in his wood and cloth airplane at College Park Airfield in 1909. What has changed since then and why?

Changes in Transportation Tour:

- Aeros Through Airplanes:
How airplanes changed from the Wright Brothers earliest planes through today.
- Neither Wind, nor Rain, nor Chance of Snow...
Become a pilot and see how flight clothing changed as airplanes improved.
- At the Controls: How things Fly:
Learn how the controls of planes from 1911 and 1939 differ as you fly our imagination plane.
- The Oldest Operating Airfield: Then and Now:
Visit the Airport up close and see how it operates.

Students will be transported through time as they experience why airplanes and aviators changed from early flying machines to the airplanes of today.

Students Will:

- Learn the differences of operating the control stick of a Wright Aeroplane, the joystick of airmail plane, and the control wheel of a more modern plane.
- See and learn why propellers, wings, and other plane parts changed shape and location as aircraft improved.
- Step out onto an operating airfield and learn what it takes to fly in and out of a small airport.
